PEDAGOGICAL MERITS

Since 2008 I have taught a number of courses in History and European Studies at undergraduate and postgraduate level. At Lund University's Centre for Languages and Literature I have participated in the development of an international summer

course in European Studies which I co-taught in 2008 and 2010.
