<b>4. Course Content</b>		
1.	Brief description of the course and its content	<i>The course consists of components intended to reinforce and develop the student's Swedish proficiency. In addition to the</i>

	including details of any sub-divisions	<i>skills training, the typical traits of Swedish grammar and phonetics are presented. The course also provides further knowledge of Swedish life and institutions. The students extend their vocabulary through reading and their listening comprehension is practised through recorded radio and television programmes. Texts are studied to extend the student's general range of words and phrases. The student's ability to discuss, engage in conversations and make short presentations is trained and pronunciation and grammar exercises are assisted by computer-based language programs. Written proficiency is practised through different written assignments.</i>
