Brief description of the course and its content including details of any sub-divisions	<i>The course is intended to enlarge the student's Swedish vocabulary and to practise oral and written proficiency. The skills training also includes a presentation of the typical traits of Swedish grammar and phonetics. The course provides information on Swedish social life and institutions and glimpses of modern Swedish literature. The students extend their productive and receptive vocabulary through reading and pronunciation exercises are assisted by computer-based language programs with a particular focus on prosodic features.</i>

1.	Teaching methods employed including details of any compulsory components	<i>Teaching consists of exercises, lectures and seminars. All elements involving skills training are compulsory.</i>
